

## Tips

- There are three types of extensions that support Joomla: Components, Modules and Plugins. For easy back-up use this component: Akeeba Backup and a must extension to install for editing : JCE- WYSIWYG Editor
- An article in Joomla is an individual Web page.
- Save or close pages after editing instead of back button or closing the browser. Page will lock and no one else can edit it.
- Do not copy and paste directly for another source (Word, Other Web site). Use notepad to copy and paste from so that there is not because this copies formatting.
- Security- Choose a good host, Use strong passwords, Keep Site up to date, back-up often
- Site Maintenance- Global Check-in, clear cache, purge expired cache
